RTFNZ/GRANT THORNTON TRANSPORT COST INDEX QUARTER ENDING JUNE 2020, REBASED TO JUNE 2019 - (PUBLISHED 29 SEPTEMBER 2020)

Please find attached the Grant Thornton (GT) index for the quarter ending June 2020, plus continuation of the forecast index to September 2020.

This latest version has been rebased to June 2019, using information provided by the 2019 operator comparison report compiled by Waikato Management School. The new base index is attached as **Appendix 1**.

Also provided is a cross-base conversion factor table to enable a continuous history of cost movements between the last four survey periods (2002, 2006, 2010 and 2015) to be calculated. This conversion table is attached as **Appendix 2**.

Two example conversion tables are included to assist readers.

The rebasing of the index was confirmed in the last index cover note but was postponed due to the introduction of the new RUC rates potentially confusing the rebasing process.

Appendix 4 includes Grant Thornton's commentary on the rebasing of the levels versus survey period.

Grant Thornton continues to provide an enhanced index (refer to pages 1 to 3) by including a year-by-year rolling comparison in table form, line graph, and bar graph representations.

Also provided is the relevant forecourt diesel prices (less GST) in table form (page 3), that support the forecast (provisional) quarterly index changes to September 2020, shown on page 2.

The diesel cost table is accompanied by its own graphical presentation of fuel price changes over the past nine months. However, we stress that the fuel data from the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) that supports the June index is provisional.

The cost index table on page 1 includes a number of important notes for users of the index. Please read these notes.

KA-27 Advisory – GT Index for June 2020

It is worth noting the index is **not** a pricing index, it is a cost index and using this exclusively to support remuneration payments without any recognition of margins has the potential to lead to financial stress for contractors.

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


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

No account has been taken of the effects of GST, which must be accounted for separately. All information is based on quarterly average prices and is obtained from either Statistics New Zealand or MBIE. MBIE has amended their methodology to account for price differences between Auckland and the rest of the country as a result of the Auckland Regional Fuel Tax. The adjustment was applied from 1 July 2018 and accordingly, historical publications do not reflect on the changes that were made.

An increase in the RUC rate came into effect on 1 July 2020. Based on advice from the Ministry of Transport, the average RUC rate increase is approximately 5.3%. We have early adopted the change to start from the June 2020 Quarter.



Note: CPI represents a basket of consumer costs and does not represent transport costs. In this graph, the CPI/ RTFNZ Index has been rebased to September 2015. The forecast index is based on the average of the diesel prices since the last indexed quarter.



The average price of diesel (excluding taxes) decreased by -18.4% to \$1.12 per litre in the June 2020 quarter over the March 2020 quarter.



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Appendix 4: Comparison of previous indices

The graph below presents the RTFNZ index at its base levels at each of its four reset periods (June 2006, March 2010, March 2015 and June 2019).



Commentary regarding changes to the base levels of the RTFNZ/Grant Thornton Transport Index

- Road user charges have reduced slightly from 12.8% of the index in March 2015 to 12.3% at June 2019.
- The weighting of fuel in the index has been relatively consistent between June 2019 and March 2015 at circa 15%. This has reduced from the levels for the June 2006 and March 2010 index.
- There has been a small increase in wages from 28.8% at March 2015 to 29.1% for the June 2019 index. The weighting of wages in the index has been increasing year on year between June 2006 to June 2016.
- Depreciation and interest are slightly higher than the prior year but is below the levels observed in March 2010.
- The allocation of owners salary have been reducing year on year which may be indicative of the larger operators in the survey.
